Public Meetings for Comprehensive Plan Update

October 2016

The City of Castroville Community Development Department is working in conjunction with the University of Texas at San Antonio to update the City's Comprehensive Plan. The comprehensive plan is a document designed to guide the future actions of our community. It presents a vision for the future, with long-range goals and objectives for all activities that affect the local government. The UTSA Team and the Master Plan Steering Committee along with City Staff will be holding public meetings to hear community input regarding the items to be included into the Final Draft of the Comprehensive Plan Update.

The first public input meeting will be held on October 20, 2016, at 2:00pm and 6:00pm at the American Legion Hall (1305 Fiorella). The purpose of this meeting is to have a work-session with community stakeholders to evaluate the strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats (SWOT) regarding this Comprehensive Plan Update. The City encourages residents to attend this meeting so that we can get as much feedback from the community as possible; so your voice can be heard.

Following the public input meeting, a new draft of the Comprehensive Plan will be prepared by the UTSA Team and presented at open meetings to City Council on November 8, 2016, and to Planning and Zoning Commission on November 9, 2016. City Council and Planning and Zoning Commission will review the draft and take final action at a later date.

City Wide Mosquito Abatement

Weather permitting, the City of Castroville will be performing citywide mosquito abatement Wednesday, October 19, 2016, from 8:00 pm until 10:00 pm. Spraying is considered to be an effective and safe way to kill adult mosquitoes. Although the pesticide is approved by the Environmental Protection Agency, residents are advised to take the following precautions:

- Do not follow the truck while it is spraying.
- Avoid being outside during spraying, close windows and keep pets inside.
- If skin or clothes are exposed, wash them with soap and water.
- Rinse homegrown fruits and vegetables with water as a general precautionary measure.
- Cover small ornamental fish ponds and bird baths.
- Because the chemical breaks down quickly in sunlight and water, no special precautions are suggested for outdoor swimming areas.

If you do come into contact with the mosquito spray, please refer to the Material Safety Data Sheet for first aid instructions. It is posted on the City Public Notice page.

Residents are also urged to reduce outdoor activity during evening and nighttime hours. When outside, cover arms and legs and use a mosquito repellant. Standing water should be eliminated promptly, as mosquitoes can grow from egg to adult as little as seven days. Breeding places for mosquitoes include swimming pools that are not kept clean, stagnant ponds, pet watering dishes, birdbaths, potted plants, old tires, empty containers, toys and clogged rain gutters and French drains.

Trick or Treat Safety Tips:



A message from Castroville Police Department:

 Have each child carry or wear something lit, such as a flashlight, glow bracelet or necklace, or flashing attire for visibility.

- Adults should plan out a route in advance and check it during the daylight for such obstacles as broken sidewalks (or no sidewalks), construction timber, or other obstacles that could trip up trick or trickers. Trick or treat in familiar neighborhoods or areas.
- Recommend well-fitting shoes to be worn.
- Avoid costumes that drag on the ground. While cute initially, costumes that drag can trip up
 little feet, get caught on bushes, and create a tussle that sometimes results in the child
 wanting to remove the costume.
- Only carry flexible props, such as knives, swords, ninja items, etc., that can cause injury if a kid accidentally falls.
- Only trick or treat at houses that are lit. Residents who do not wish to be bothered by trick or treaters often leave off their lights as a sign.
- Feed your kids a healthy meal prior to going trick or treat. Your children will be happier, and it
 will help reduce the temptation of kids wanting to devour candy from the first trick or treat
 stop.
- Children of any age should be accompanied by a parent.
