## **BEAT THE HEAT AND STAY COOL!**

As the summer temperatures continue to climb, it is important to prevent heat related illness. People at greater risk for heat related illness are infants, young children, people who are 65 years of age or older, overweight, or physically ill, especially with heart disease or high blood pressure. A few simple precautions can help you stay cool and enjoy the summer:

- •Wear lightweight, light-colored, loose-fitting clothing.
- •Stay in an air-conditioned place as much as possible. Go to the public library or city hall if you need a retreat from the heat. Just a few hours in air conditioning can help your body stay cooler.
- •Limit outdoor activity to the morning or evening hours.
- •Cut down exercise during the heat.
- •Avoid hot and heavy meals.
- •Wear sunscreen.
- •Drink plenty of fluids.
- Replace salts and minerals lost through sweat by drinking a sports drink.
- •Do not leave children or pets in vehichles.
- •Use the buddy system when working in the heat, or have a friend or relative call to check on adults 65 years old or older who reside in an unairconditioned dwelling at least twice a day.

## STAGE 1

## **Voluntary Drought Restrictions**

The City of Castroville uses drought restrictions, established by city ordinance, to proactively manage the water resources.

- \*Water waste is prohibited at all times. Water waste includes allowing water to run off into a gutter, ditch, or drain; or failing to repair a controllable leak.
- Reduce water consumption by any means available.
- **Hand watering** with a hand-held hose, soaker hose, drip irrigation, bucket or watering can is permitted at any time.
- Grey watering is allowed at any time.
- All non-public swimming pools must have a minimum of 25 percent of the surface area covered with evaporation screens when not in use. Inflatable pool toys or floating decorations may be used.
- \*Washing impervious cover such as parking lots, driveways, streets or sidewalks is prohibited. Health and safety exceptions to this rule may be requested from the City in writing.
- \*Residential washing of vehicles or other equipment is allowed only on assigned watering days and times and during the weekend. A hose with an automatic shut-off nozzle or bucket of five gallons or less may be used. Water should not be allowed to run into the street.
- The use of commercial car wash facilities is allowed any day.

Stage One restrictions continue until there is an announcement in the newspaper that Stage One has ended or that Stage Two is in effect.

MILD water shortage conditions.

Landscape watering with an irrigation system or sprinkler is allowed only once a week before 10 a.m. or after 8 p.m. on your designated watering day as determined by your address:

Watering days begin and end at midnight; overnight watering is not allowed.

Areas without a street address, such as medians and neighborhood entryways, water on Wednesday.

Voluntary conservation on your part now helps avoid the need for mandatory restrictions later.
