CASTROVILLE MUNICIPAL AIRPORT - KCVB UPDATE



The first part of 2021 has been very eventful for the airport! COVID-19 has re-defined the way operations and physical interactions take place. The airport staff has diligently worked with the FAA and TxDOT Aviation to ensure minimal disruption in services.

The Airport Advisory Board remains very active. The monthly meetings are productive, and the participation by the board members and citizens has been outstanding. There have been many fruitful discussions and several ideas shared to continue the airport's growth and to support the surrounding community.

In the past six months, two different Scouting troops have come through to earn their Aviation Merit Badges. Airport staff met with the scouts, and the smiles and the looks of amazement were priceless! They all received a tour of the airport, got a glimpse into daily operations, and held a Q&A session. Although not everyone wanted to be a pilot, all were introduced to the other aspects of Aviation. Some were interested in Air Traffic Control, others interested in aircraft maintenance, and some just liked the idea of refueling airplanes.

Dream Flights held their first Pilot Conference at the airport in May. There were over 55 pilots and crews in attendance. BRUSH UP ON BULK PICKUP

The City of Castroville has contracted Waste Management to collect no more than a total of six (6) cubic yards of Brush, Bundles, and Bulk Waste from residents once per month and will not collect any excess material over the six (6) cubic yard allowance. Brush/Bulk piles must not contain hazardous material, construction/demolition debris, or items generated by a third-party contractor. All items must be placed at the curb by the resident. Please keep in mind that tree, shrub, or brush trimmings should not exceed four (4) feet in length, six (6) inches in diameter, or fifty (50) pounds in weight. DO NOT place your brush piles under power lines, low-hanging trees, utility posts, fences, or any items that the grabbing arm would damage. It is essential to ensure your bulk/brush pile is within the six (6) cubic yard monthly allowance and placed at the curb/point of collection before the service period. If your pile is not placed at the curb or point of collection prior to the service period, you may risk having to wait until the following collection and face a citation for a code enforcement violation. Orange flags and contractors' tape will mark piles with non-compliant material or piles that exceeded the six (6) cubic yard limit and have already had the contracted allowance removed from the stack.
