## PREFACE

Mary Keller was born and reared in Castroville. Her parents were Louis Mangold and Annie Conrad, both Alsatians. Her father was a grocer and dry goods merchant in Castroville. Mary married William Keller who was also in the mercantile business in LaCoste. They built a new home and moved to LaCoste, the same home she lives in today. Mary and her husband reared five children, and they celebrated their golden wedding anniversary. Mr. Keller died in 1971. Mary is 86 years old and is still very active and in good health.
